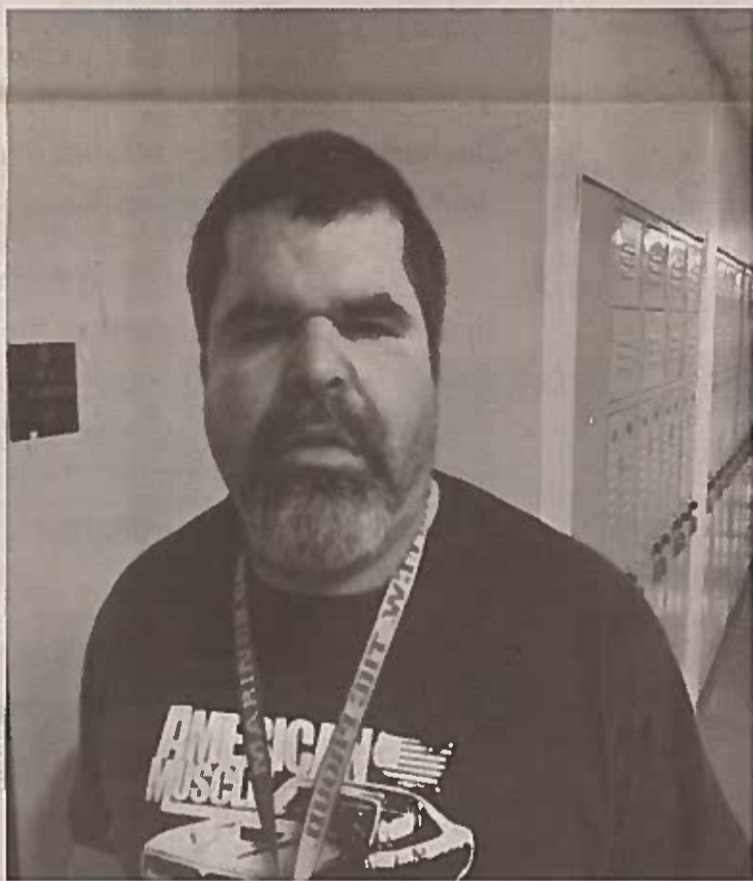

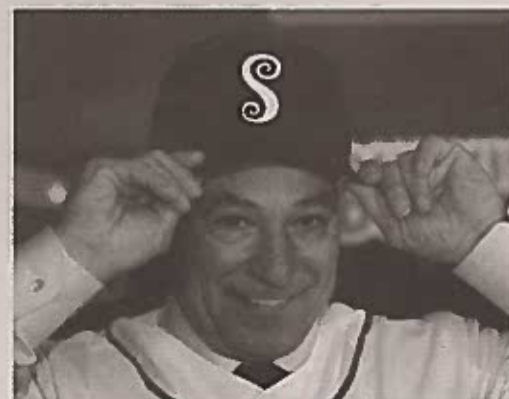

## Cafeteria to Undergo Massive Changes

The Stamford High Cafeteria will undergo significant changes for next school year. These changes will be noticed in two ways the appearance and the food. Stamford High's Cafeteria will have a new food company (with more choices) and more seating for seniors.

The new food service company will take over the contract that was held by Chartwell's. The new style of the cafeteria food will include many different eateries for students to choose from including Subway, Panda Express, Dominos and Dunkin Donuts, in addition to a salad place and a burger / hot dog place. The Dunkin Donuts will be opened all day. The manager of a nearby Dunkin Donuts, who did not want to be named said, "This is really going to hurt

the sales over here since the students will not need to walk off campus to get coffee."

In addition to the change of food distributors, the cafeteria will undergo extensive renovations. There will be new tables installed inside the cafeteria and another door to exit in the back of cafeteria. However, the biggest change will be a second floor created in the back of the cafeteria which will serve as a lounge and special eating area for seniors. The area will feature a spa, bungee jump and 12 new Samsung 3D 80" LCD

televisions.

construction workers are going to be working non-stop 12 hour shifts, including Sundays.

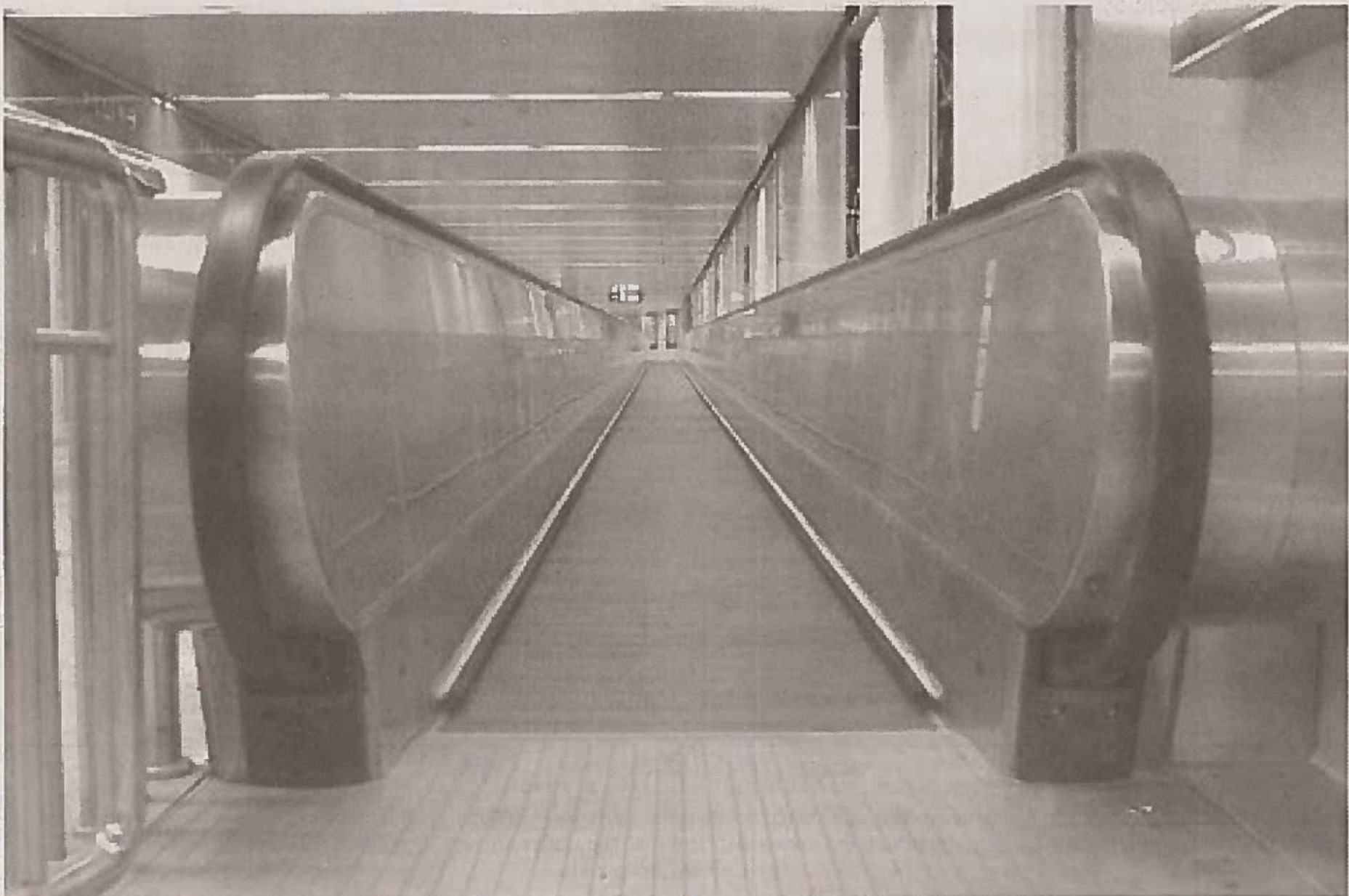
