This year the Stamford Public Schools have implemented a new and innovative program in the 3 high schools. It is the Executive High School Internship Program. The coordinator for the program in Stamford is Mrs. Frances Howes.

During the first semester of the year Mrs. Howes took applications from students at all three high schools, and selected a small group of students to partake in the pilot project. Then working through the Stamford Area Commerce and Industry Association (SACIA) she found sponsors for these students who could provide the intern with a unique experience in the student's field of interest.

On Monday through Thursday of every week, the Intern puts in a full working day with

his sponsor. On Friday the Interns meet at the Staff Development Center at Martha Hoyt School for a seminar in business which lasts from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

At Stamford High there are eight students in the program.

Sponsors include, Congressman McKinney's Office, Governor Grasso Southern Office. The Hanrahan Center and Pitney Bowes.
